


St Paul's Cathedral

This is the entrance for school groups. It will take you downstairs to a place called the Crypt.



There are friendly security staff here; they are here to keep us safe.

There are some stairs leading down to the welcome area. Someone will greet you there and show you what to do next.

If you are using a wheelchair, you might visit through this step free entrance.





At the step free entrance you can get a lift fob from a Visitor Experience Assistant. This lift will take you to the Crypt and the Cathedral Floor.

They work all around the Cathedral and are always on hand to help


Learning Team

Places you will see on your visit




Crypt

Wheelchair users can use the lift and chair lift to get upstairs.







