Purpose of the Job

The purpose of this job is to support the delivery of the Choral Partnerships Programme.

Choral Partnerships Programme

The Programme is designed to build sustainable partnerships with schools, communities and churches in areas where musical provision is limited or non-existent, especially those in financially deprived areas across the Diocese of London. The Programme builds on the living tradition of St Paul's Cathedral Choir, enabling London children to connect meaningfully with it, giving them a voice in the Cathedral and in their wider communities. It is envisaged that the Programme might also create new pathways for a diverse range of girls and boys to pursue choristership.

Main Duties

- To assist the Artistic Director of Choral Partnerships with termly planning for weekly school engagements
- To deliver vocal tuition sessions in schools engaged with the Choral Partnerships Programme (approx. 8 hours of tuition per week)
- Prepare pupils for any agreed performances both in school and at the Cathedral
- Liaise with the Music Outreach team to organise school visits to the Cathedral
- Maintain a dialogue with Choral Partner School Head Teachers and produce termly reports which outline repertoire covered and National Curriculum progression
- Liaise with class teachers and keep them informed of specific achievements and any behavioural concerns
- Enable the growth of our after-school deanery choir network
- Undertake any other duties as commensurate with the role as agreed with the Artistic Director of Choral Partnerships
